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1. General description of the data set:


The Asymmetry Project corpus includes Dutch participants: 31 children (mean 5;6), 20 young adults (mean 26;2), 20 elderly adults (mean 78;8). The participants produced structured narratives, based on four storybooks of six pictures each. The main research goal for which the task was designed is the study of subject anaphora in relation to discourse topic and topic shift. Both CHAT-transcripts and WMA-sound files are available in CHILDES / TALKBANK.

2. Restrictions to be placed on the use of the data:

No restrictions are placed on the use of transcripts or sound files of the children, young adults and elderly adults in the CK-subcorpus.
